SYLLABUS

Welcome to Fourth Grade!

We are excited to welcome you to the 2018/2019 school year! This syllabus is meant to give you a brief overview of the expectations, procedures, and curriculum for fourth grade this school year.

ATTENDANCE

- All children should be lined up outside by 8:10AM. Children will be allowed into the school building when the bell rings at 8:15AM. If a child arrives after 8:25AM, they will be marked as tardy on attendance rosters.
- If a child is absent, please send a note to school either before or the day after the absence(s), so that the absence(s) is marked as excused.

RECESS

We have twenty minutes of recess every day. Recess is a time for children to relax and interact with one another outside the classroom. We strive to have recess outside, however when weather does not permit this, children enjoy twenty minutes of indoor recess in the gym. Please make sure that students are bundled appropriately in cold weather as we do go outside in the winter.

HOMEWORK

Each week, the fourth grade team will send home a newsletter/homework packet on Monday that will be due on Friday (unless otherwise noted). This packet will contain language arts homework and Math homework for the week. Homework in social studies/science will not be included in the packet, as students will not always have homework in those subjects every week.



SAFETY

It is the goal of all the teachers and staff at Waters School that students are provided a safe environment to learn and grow in. As a consequence, we ask the following of parents, caregivers, and students alike:

Children will only be released to people authorized on their emergency forms. We must receive written permission from parents beforehand in order to release any child to persons not indicated on those forms.

We ask parents to not wait in the hallways or inside the building because this is a fire hazard as well as a safety hazard for students in the building.

- If parents are found in the hallways they will be asked by staff to wait outside or be directed to the school office. Safety is our number one concern.
- Children will not be allowed back inside the school building once school ends, unless they are enrolled in an afterschool program. If reentry is necessary, children and parents must go through the front office first.
- In cold weather, students will be allowed to wait in the annex. Students are not allowed in the hallways or on staircases before school begins.
